**1582. APOLOGIES & REASONS FOR ABSENCE.**

1582.1. Cllr. I Sherwood – Work Commitments.

1582.2. Cllr. J Skinner – Unwell.

**1583. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST** – for items included on the Agenda.

1583.1. Cllr. C Gunner declared a personal interest on anything to do with the Museum.

The meeting was adjourned at 6.50p.m.

The meeting was re-convened at 7.05p.m.

**1584. REPORTS: police, principal authority etc**

1584.1. PCSO Tampin reported there had been 30 offences in Swaffham including burglary, criminal damage, drug offences, fraud & forgery, theft and violence against persons. It was also reported there had been no calls to the Police between 31<sup>st</sup> October & 5<sup>th</sup> November, there was just one domestic incident.

Dereham LAG are dealing with the issue of the poultry market in Lynn Road on a Saturday following a number of complaints. There are environmental health issues to be dealt with including the toilets, nowhere to wash hands where there is food being served. It was also stated there is too much traffic parked in the area which makes it dangerous for vehicles coming out of Gasworks Lane.

PCSO Tampin also reported there is now a residents group set up for Sandringham Way, funding for this has been secured for one year with meetings taking place at Hamonds High School. The Police team will now be targeting speeding vehicles in Watton Road and anti-social behaviour and parking issues in Highfield Avenue. The following dates were also given for street briefings: 3<sup>rd</sup> December 6.00pm – 7.30pm Assembly Rooms, 12<sup>th</sup> December 10.00am – 12noon Market Place, 21<sup>st</sup> December 2.00pm – 3.30pm Market Place, 8<sup>th</sup> January 2.00pm – 3.30pm Suffield Court and 19<sup>th</sup> January 5.30pm – 7.00pm outside the Town Hall.

1584.2. COUNTY COUNCILLOR, Cllr Ann Steward reported the emphasis is now on preparing the budget, keeping the services but for less money. She also reported the day services are not closing they are just being delivered in a different way.

Cllr. Steward informed the meeting she has now resigned from the Breckland Cabinet with a move to Norfolk County Council Cabinet; she is looking forward to the challenge and being proactive with a lot to bring to Swaffham. Economics will be her main role covering the whole of Norfolk, there is funding in Europe which it will be nice to get hold of. Cllr. Steward asked for anyone interested in business to contact her.

1584.3. BRECKLAND COUNCILLOR, Cllr. Shirley Matthews reported there are benefits with sharing services with South Norfolk. They are looking very closely at money. The bidding for the Choice Based Lettings scheme is going well. There will be a welcome home parade in Dereham on 4<sup>th</sup> December for the Light Dragoons.

On Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> November there will be an event in the Assembly Rooms between 4.00pm and 7.00pm regarding changes in the law relating to community events and licensing, this information will aid community events.

1587.1. Information has been received from our tree surgeon David Machin in respect of trees at the Recreation Ground overhanging 56 Greehoe Place. The report confirms that the tree is not a health & safety risk, but at a cost of £120 the resident concerned can have the offending branches removed at his own cost.

**It was unanimously agreed to write to Mr Ward informing him the tree is not a health & safety risk enclosing a copy of the report with the cost.**

1587.2. Code of Conduct cards have been circulated to Councillors at the meeting – these were picked up from the Standards Board trade stand at the SLCC national conference at Daventry recently.

1587.3. The Town Clerk reported he had attended a meeting at Iceland Stores earlier this week at the request of the Environmental Health Officer at Breckland. This was to try and resolve a complaint in respect of early deliveries. Jason Glasspoole from Highways was also present. The deliveries arrive at Iceland for 5.00a.m. The drivers are getting there prior to this time leaving their engines running; they will now be waiting out of town until 5.00a.m.

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1588.4. 1588.6. It was reported there is a lengthy document in the Town Hall relating to the Norfolk Minerals & Waste Local Development Framework – site Allocations Development Plan Documents – Consultation on Preferred options 19<sup>th</sup> October to 11<sup>th</sup> December 2009. This is a very lengthy document (340 pages long). It was suggested for members of the Planning Committee to look at this document and formulate any observations or comments from the Town Council.

**1589. FINANCE:**

1589.1. The Council were circulated with an interim list of payments for November 2009 prior to the meeting which has been updated at the meeting this evening.

**It was unanimously agreed to accept the list of payments.**

Cllr. A Steward left the meeting at 7.35p.m.

1589.2. Further e-mailed correspondence with KLARS has been circulated at the meeting confirming funding has been received from the Lloyds TSB Foundation. This will cover the Project workers hours until the end of November 2011 (when all KLARS current funding ceases). This will include the cost of hiring one room at the Town Hall from 1<sup>st</sup> April 2010. In the recent report KLARS gave an example of a case study to give the Council an idea of the type of issues they deal with on behalf of the migrant worker community and/or any foreign speaking resident.

1589.3. To receive and consider 'Your Parish your decision' – Participatory Budgeting scheme inviting grant applications for schemes from £500 to £5,000. There may be some of the 'quick wins' from the Town Plan that would be appropriate to put forward for this grant funding. The 'plastic bag free town' is a possibility.

1589.4. It was reported an adverse possession claim could be made to the Land Registry for 'The Shambles' and voluntary registration of all land and property owned by the Town council with the Land Registry.

The Town Clerk and the Mayor attended a Larger Councils training event at Cringleford near Norwich recently. There was a presentation by the Land Registry and a great deal of information has been collected for future reference. The presentation centred on the voluntary registration of land and property owned by local councils and in particular by Town & Parish Councils. The vast majority of Council land and property is not registered and therefore the Council are reliant on copies of old deeds etc. Voluntary registration of all Council land and property would cost in the region of £400 which is less than half the cost of a fireproof cabinet that would protect the deeds for an extra half an hour. The registration would make information available on-line at the Land Registry, thus give greater protection to these important documents.

In the case of 'The Shambles' an adverse possession claim for ownership appears to be the only way of resolving this long standing issue. This would be done with the assistance of Breckland Council who could by the use of statutory declarations add evidence to the Town Council's claim. With the ownership would come the responsibility of maintenance and management of this area. Following a discussion Cllr T Jennison proposed and Cllr. C Gunner seconded to make an adverse possession claim to the Land Registry for the Shambles, and to register all other Town Council Land and Property.

**It was unanimously agreed to make an adverse possession claim to the Land Registry for the Shambles.**

**1590. GENERAL CORRESPONDENCE:**

1590.3. E-mailed correspondence with CGM contractors for the public toilets for information only. The contractors CGM have reported various bouts of petty vandalism including a further incidence of excrement graffiti in the past week.

1590.4. 'Norfolk Link' October edition of the journal of the Norfolk Association of Local Councils has been circulated to all Councillors for information only. Norfolk Link covers all aspects of local council work at the parish & town council level.

1590.5. 'Living Longer, Living Well' – the older people's strategy 2009 – 2011 has been circulated to all Councillors for information only. This strategy sets out changes in health, social care, housing and other linked services in line with local needs, government policies and older people's aspirations for the next three years.

1590.8. The first meeting of the working party for the Public Toilets will take place in the next fortnight and the aim is to present their findings to the Council at the January meeting or if time does not allow then the February meeting at the latest.

1590.9. A request from Cllr C. Gunner regarding Swaffham in Bloom 2010 with supporting information has been circulated to all Councillors for consideration. Cllr Gunner addressed the Council referring to a proposed meeting of a working party at the Community Centre; and the possibility of the Town Council offering support and/or assistance. Following a discussion Cllr. S Lister proposed and Cllr. D Wickerson seconded to enter the flowers in the town into the Swaffham in Bloom 2010 competition.

## Appendix 1

Public Toilets – A question was asked what the benefits of closing the Public Toilets are.

The Mayor stated the problems are with the cost, but the advantages are there will be more toilets in the town, as they will be in businesses there will be less vandalism. They will be safer and cleaner than the public toilets are. The funding will not last 10 years.

Public Toilets – The public are deterred from using the toilets in the Assembly Rooms.

The Town Clerk thanked the EDP reporter for getting it right in the local press stating the public toilets will close when an alternative is in place. The Council will come back at the January or February Town Council meeting once the working group have the information needed. This is not a decision the Council has taken lightly, there are costs relating to vandalism, council tax, water rates and cleaning. The aim of the Council is to be self funding within 5 years.

Public Toilets – A question was asked, what are you hoping to achieve?

The Town Clerk stated the public toilets are costing £23,000 a year, the Council were given an amount of money from Breckland Council to last 10 years, it will only last 5 years. The last 2 years have not been easy; there are examples in the Council pack. The Town Clerk suggested that should further information be needed to make an appointment to come and see him.

Public Toilets – The Richmond Scheme talked about before is a wide scheme, while the extension of the toilets is commended this cannot cover the needs of all.

Public Toilets – Instead of a poll why not put a slip in the newsletter. If not enough businesses take up the proposal what will happen?

The Town Clerk stated information will be brought to the January or February meeting, at present they are a drain on finances, we do not want to bump up the Council Tax.

Public Toilets – The Buses all stop in Swaffham because of the Public Toilets, which in turn brings money into Swaffham as they shop and drink here.

Public Toilet – Health walks have been arranged for Swaffham because there is the provision of Public Toilets.
